Hoosier Uplands has been awarded funding that enables them to move forward this fall with two affordable housing projects according to David Miller, Hoosier Uplands CEO.

The local non profit agency will assume ownership this fall of Taylor Apartments in Campbellsburg, a sixteen unit USDA Rural Development project that was constructed in the 1970's. Once the ownership change has been made, Hoosier Uplands will begin an extensive re-modeling and updating of the apartments. "We think the tenants and the community will be very pleased with the upgrades and improvements," Miller said.

Also, Hoosier Uplands will begin construction on "phase 2" of Lost River Place Apartments in Orleans. Phase 1 was completed in 2007 and included twenty-four apartments located just south of Orleans. Phase 2 will be made up of sixteen additional apartments that will include twelve 3-bedroom units and four 4-bedroom units. "There seems to be a great need for affordable apartments with the 3 & 4 bedroom makeup and we hope to fill some of that need," Miller said.

Hoosier Uplands has housing facilities in Bedford, Mitchell, Salem, Loogootee, Orleans, and Marengo.
